

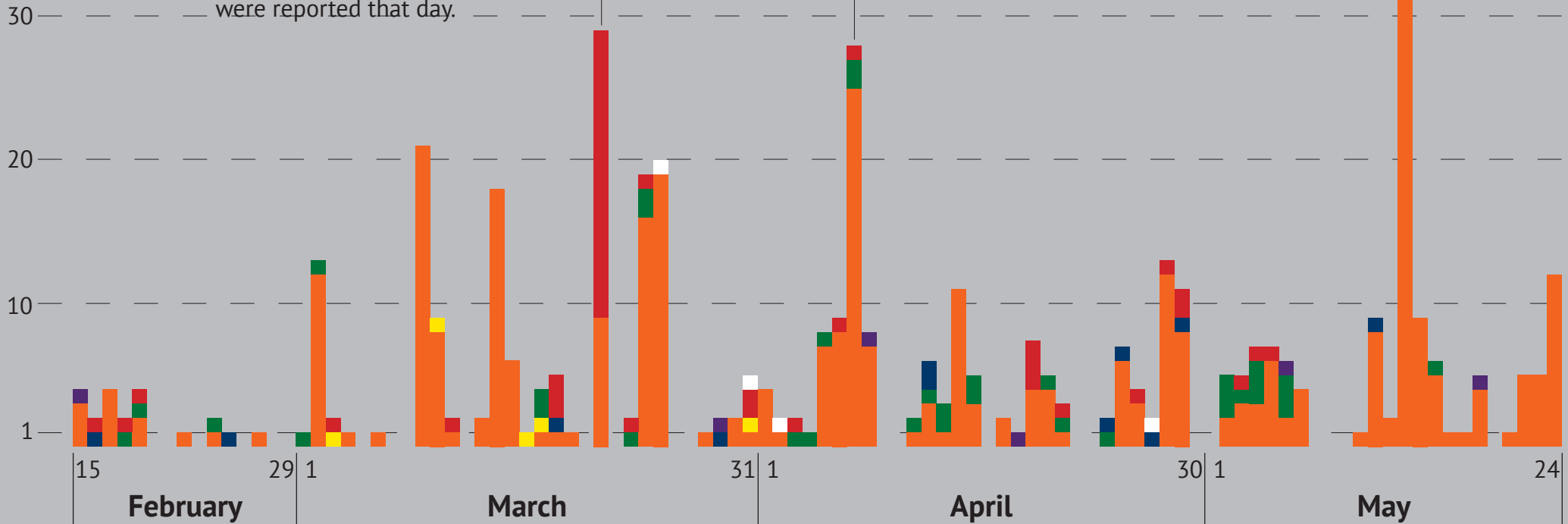
# 100 Days of Human Rights Violations

Number of affected persons/organizations

**21 March** Authorities identified participants of a public assembly supporting the release of Ukrainian pilot Nadya Savchenko and denied the permission of two proposed marches for Freedom Day. Furthermore, police raids at the houses of 20 assumed fans of Partisan Minsk were reported that day.

**7 April** Court hearings were held with participants of the legal demonstration on Freedom Day and those involved in a public assembly in support of Nadya Savchenko.

**14 May** Activists dressed Minsk's Independence Avenue around October Square in white-red-white flags. The police closed the capital's main road and pretended, by means of mass presence of road sweepers, that the street needed to be cleaned. More than 30 people were identified and will face charges.
